Introduction

On 17th October, 2017, the Department of Geography arranged a field study programme at Kaziranga National Park for students in the 5th Semester of Geography (Major and General) to fulfill the requirements for the practical paper.

Kaziranga National Park is situated mainly in Golaghat district and in Nagaon district of Assam. It is about 191.6 km from away Guwahati. The National Park covers an area of 430 square kilometers with 6 ranges (divisions).

Objectives

The main objectives of this study are:

- 1. To study about the in-situ conservation of biodiversity.
- 2. To examine the challenges confronted by Kaziranga National Park.

Methodology

Relevant information was collected from the Director of the park and other park officials. Field visits were made to various locations in the park to get first hand impression of the park.

- 2. Students asked people who live nearby about land encroachment in Kaziranga and unauthorized outsider ingress.

- 4. Students discussed with the concerned authority about the Rhino poaching, a major problem for Kaziranga National Park.
